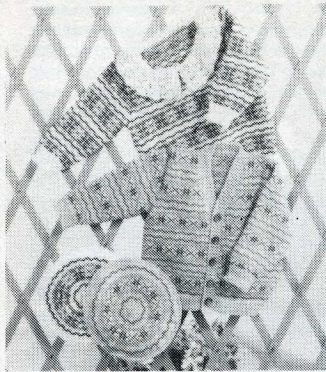


pattern 8



MAIN TENSION

30 sts and 40 rows to 10cm measured over Fair Isle patt (tension dial approx 7=MT). Tension must be matched exactly before starting garment.

ABBREVIATIONS

See page 59.

NOTE

Knit side is used as right side. Measurements given are those of finished garment and should not be used to measure work on the machine.

PUNCHCARD/MYLAR SHEET PATTERNS

Punch cards or mark mylar sheet before starting to knit. Punchcard 1 used for Fair Isle patterning. Punchcard 2 used for lace patterning on sweater collar.

PATTERN NOTE

Lace pattern: Card punched and marked for Brother machines. Other machines use fashion/multi transfer lace.

Knitmaster and Silver Reed machines: move arrows for return rows (ie. for K only rows), down by 2 rows throughout.

Fair Isle pattern: worked on Fair Isle setting throughout, changing colours in both feeders as follows:

Note: where MC/A shown, then colour at left of line is used in feeder 1/A and colour at right in feeder 2/B. In example, MC would be used in feeder 1/A whilst A would be used in feeder 2/B.

BOY'S

K2 rows MC/A
K2 rows MC only

K1 row MC/B
K1 row B only
K2 rows B/MC
K2 rows C/D
K1 row C/E
K2 rows C/D
K2 rows B/MC
K1 row B only
K1 row MC/B
K2 rows MC only

K2 rows MC/A

K4 rows MC only
These 25 rows form one complete patt.

GIRLS'S

K2 rows MC/A
K2 rows MC only

K1 row MC/B
K1 row B only
K2 rows B/MC
K2 rows MC/D
K1 row MC/A
K2 rows MC/D
K2 rows B/MC
K1 row B only
K1 row MC/B
K2 rows MC only

K2 rows MC/A

K4 rows MC
These 25 rows form one complete patt.

SPECIAL NOTE

Crochet cast on edge was used for lace collar. This technique is often explained in your basic manual. If not, work thus:

Using WY and MT, cast on and K a few rows ending CAL. Using nylon cord, K1 row. CAR. Push all Ns to HP. Thread MC through yarn brake but not in carr. Make a slip knot and slip on to first N at left. Starting at left edge, take latch tool and hold loop of slip knot behind latch. Wrap yarn around left end N. Insert latch tool between the first and second Ns on left from below and catch the yarn with the latch tool. Keeping the yarn in the hook of the latch tool, pull yarn through chain loop and slip hook behind latch, making first st. Move tool between next 2 Ns. Rep the procedure of catching the yarn and forming the loops along the row until the last N. Place loop on latch tool on to hook of N. Thread up carr and K the first row.

MACHINES: These instructions are written for standard gauge punchcard or electronic machines with ribber. We used a Brother 950i

MACHINES WITHOUT

RIBBER: See page 59

YARN: Spectrum Vermont 4 ply Perlé

FIBRE CONTENT: 100% Acrylic

COLOUR: We used Shade 875 Arctic Grey (MC), Shade 877 Pot Pourri (A), Shade 874 Aster (B), Shade 852 Serpentine (C), Shade 862 Cream (D) and Shade 861 Red (E) for boy's set.

We used Shade 855 Apricot (MC), Shade 880 Wine (A), Shade 877 Pot Pourri (B), Shade 856 Honey (C) and Shade 862 Cream (D) for girl's set

SIZES

To suit chest 41[46:51:56]cm.
Finished measurement 46[51:56:61]cm.
Length 24.5[28:31.5:34.5]cm.
Sleeve seam 13[15:18:20]cm.
Figures in square brackets [] refer to larger sizes; where there is only one set of figures, this applies to all sizes.

MATERIALS

Spectrum Vermont 4 ply Perlé.
2 x 100g balls in MC.
1 x 100g ball in each of A, B C and D.
Small amount of E.

CARDIGAN

5 buttons.

BERETS

Narrow elastic.

GARMENT WEIGHS

For size 51cm
Sweater: 140g.
Cardigan: 140g.
Beret: 40g.
